Red (pedestrians) light
indicates that
pedestrians should
STOP,
Green (pedestrians) light
indicates that
pedestrians should **GO**.

When crossing the
street, first look left,
then right, then left
again.
Don't cross unless
you're sure.

The **red**
"Pedestrian" light
means **STOP**, and
the **green**
"Pedestrian" light
means **GO**

Before heading out, always
walk on the sidewalk and
use pedestrian crossings; do
not run.

If the light is red, **STOP**;
even if it turns green, do not
cross without looking left-
right-left first.

Drivers might not see you
at school crossings, so be
careful.

In the dark or rainy weather, wear
a reflective vest or bright-colored
clothing so that drivers can see
you immediately.
