



FOG: Invisible Danger, Safe Driving Guide

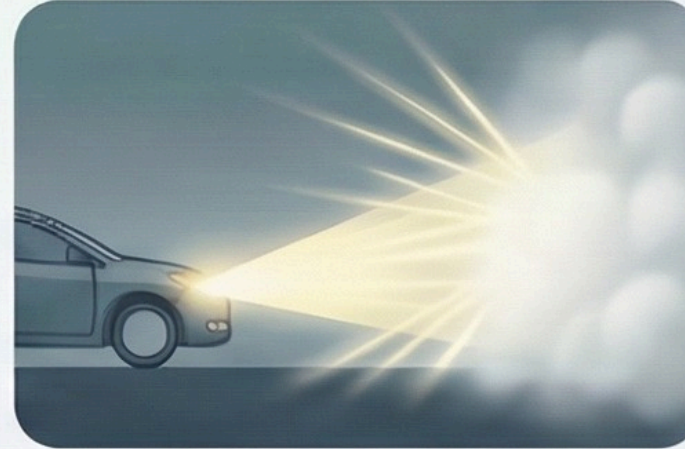
Fog reduces visibility below 1 km, impairs perception, and increases pile-up risk.
This guide outlines dangers and safe driving techniques.



Problem: Effects of Fog on Driving Safety



Visibility and Perception Impaired
(Speed and distance estimation difficult, dangers detected too late).



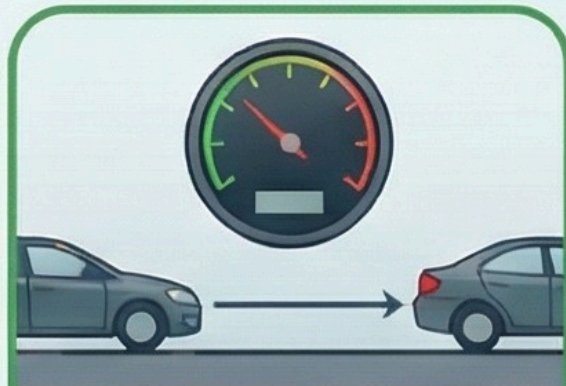
High Beams Create a "Light Wall"
(High beams reflect off fog droplets, worsening visibility).



Increased Pile-up Risk

Solution: Life-Saving Rules in Foggy Weather

DO: Safe Steps



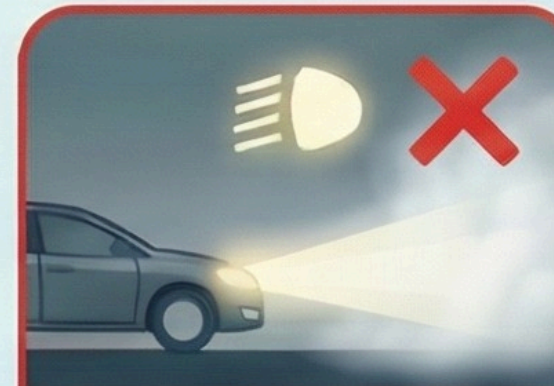
Reduce Speed, Increase Following Distance
(Drive at a speed where you can stop safely)



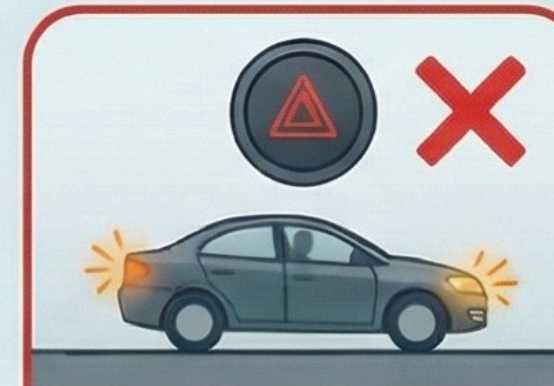
Use Low Beams and Fog Lights
(See and be seen; this is the most important rule)



Use Road Lines as Reference
(Follow fixed lines, not the car ahead)



Never Use High Beams
(Reflected light completely obstructs view)



Do Not Use Hazard Lights While Moving
(Hazards are only for sudden stops or danger)



Avoid Sudden Braking and Overtaking
(Fog distorts distance perception, making these maneuvers very dangerous)
