

THE TOOLS OF INDEPENDENCE (CORRECT USE)



TACTILE GUIDING SURFACES (YELLOW LINES)

Parallel lines guide movement, while dotted textures warn of steps or changes in direction.

RAMPS AND ELEVATORS

These serve as essential "bridges" for wheelchairs to navigate height differences between roads and sidewalks.



AUDIBLE TRAFFIC SIGNALS

These "ticking" sounds act as a guide, telling visually impaired pedestrians when it is safe to cross.



COMMON VIOLATIONS & THEIR IMPACTS (WRONG ACTIONS)

OCCUPYING YELLOW LINES VS. NAVIGATION

Placing signs or packages on tactile surfaces blocks a blind person's only navigation path.



BLOCKING RAMPS VS. ROAD SAFETY

Parking in front of a ramp forces wheelchair users into dangerous vehicle lanes to bypass the curb.



MISUSING PARKING & TRANSFER ZONES

Using striped "transfer spaces" prevents disabled drivers from being able to exit or enter their vehicles.
