### WHAT DO THE LAWS SAY?

**5199 Animal Protection Law (Article 21):** A driver who hits an animal is obliged to take it to the nearest veterinarian or treatment unit or ensure that it is taken there.

**Traffic Insurance Coverage:** Compulsory Financial Liability Insurance covers treatment costs in case of hitting an animal.

### RISK GROUPS BY REGION

- Urban Roads:** Cats, dogs, birds.
- Inter City Roads:** Dogs, wild boars, foxes.
- Pasture and Village Roads:** Livestock (cows, horses), small ruminants
- Forest and Mountain Roads:** Bears, deer, roe deer, jackals.



### REPORTING AND INTERVENTION

**112 Emergency Call Center:** You can report injured animal notifications by calling 112.

**HAYDI Mobile Application:** You can make instant reports via the Animal Status Tracking (HAYDI) application of the General Directorate of Security.

**Municipalities:** You can request emergency intervention by contacting the directorate of veterinary affairs of the municipality in your area.
